"For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love, and of self-discipline." 2 Timothy 1:6-7

Have you ever received something like a left-handed bacon stretcher as a gift for Christmas? The thought is nice, but what am I going to do with it? I'm right-handed! Sometimes the perfect gift is a gift card, one that you can use anywhere for anything you need.
