From the Pastor

Dear Wausau First Family of Faith,

Where have you recently seen God at work? As we journey through Lent and the theme of "Dynamite Prayer," we can both pray and see powerful ways that the Holy Spirit is working in hearts, minds, and lives in ourselves and our church.

One example of answered prayer is regarding our church building's new identity beginning on March 1. After years of prayer, discernment, discussion, collaboration, and voting, this date marks the beginning of a new era. We have created a new non-profit in partnership with the Hmong American Center and the Community Foundation, with the Community Foundation acting as the Fiscal Sponsor. Beginning this month, our congregation signed a 99-year renewable lease to this new non-profit to oversee the use, maintenance, and improvements of the building we call home.

It may seem like a simple issue, but we needed a name for this collaborative and innovative non-profit. We wanted it to be meaningful to both the Hmong community and our faith, as well as simple enough to engage the broader region. There did not seem to be many ideas at first, so I asked Yee Leng Xiong, the Executive Director of the Hmong American Center, to see if they had any suggestions.

At our next meeting, he explained that there is a Hmong phrase pronounced *shawl shia*, which means "warm hearts." He wondered if the building could be called the "Warm Hearts Center." What he did not know is that "warm hearts" is also very meaningful in our Methodist heritage.

In 1738, John Wesley was feeling discouraged after a long series of setbacks, including a failed missionary journey to Savannah, his sweetheart married someone else, and he was kicked out of preaching in Anglican churches because of his "enthusiasm". His faith was shaken, but he went to a Moravian Bible Study and prayer group meeting on Aldersgate Street in London. As they read Martin Luther's preface to the book of Romans, John suddenly felt his "heart strangely warmed." He wrote about it in his journal, "I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."

As Methodists, we continue to trust in Christ to give us warm hearts. God is at work among us, even in the strange way of connecting us to Christ and one other with warm hearts. It is a beautiful experience and name for the building moving forward. Let us pray that everyone coming into the Warm Hearts Center will have their heart warmed.
